Credits – instructions for converting local credits into ECTS credits

One year of full-time study equals 60 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) credits. To work out the conversion factor (CF) for your courses and degree(s), multiply the number of years of your degree with 60. Then divide the result with the total number of local credits awarded for the degree. Expressed as a formula:

$$\frac{\text{the number of years of your degree} * 60}{\text{total number of local credits for the degree}} = \text{conversion factor (CF)}$$

Example 1 (3-year degree, US & Canada):

$$\frac{3 * 60}{90} = \frac{180}{90} = \text{CF: 2}$$

Example 2 (4-year degree, India):

$$\frac{4 * 60}{160} = \frac{240}{160} = \text{CF: 1.5}$$

To apply the CF to individual courses, projects, etc., multiply local credits with the CF. Thus, 4 credits from a US university equal 8 ECTS credits ($4*2=8$), while 4 credits from an Indian university equal 6 ECTS credits ($4*1.5=6$).
